### **ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL** ROUNDUP

NYONE who tuned the Novice bands during the A period of the 1967 ARRL Novice Roundup, February 4-19, knows well the impact of this contest. Imagine the confusion present in the minds of the few who were not aware of this activity . . . they learned quickly!

Participation and scores are up again this year, perhaps a bit reminiscent (for the old timers) of the last sunspot peak almost 10 years ago. Top scorer in the contest was WN3FLN posting 37,-133 points with 508 QSOs in 71 ARRL sections and 38 hours on the air pounding brass. Others in the top bracket scoring over 20,000 points were WN5PPF WNØPHA WN2YQH WN3GZM WNØPPK WN1GTH WN8UHN WN9SKU WN9SWO and WN6SVV. FB OMs! And well done to all 320 Novices and 133 Non-Novices who submitted logs.



contest was an experience I will never forget! Working W1AW was one of my biggest thrills." - WN4EKI. "Concerning the contest, as a whole, I didn't like it. Maybe because I already have WAS and there was nothing to gain. There weren't enough Novices in it. It seemed as if everybody quit at the end of the first week.
