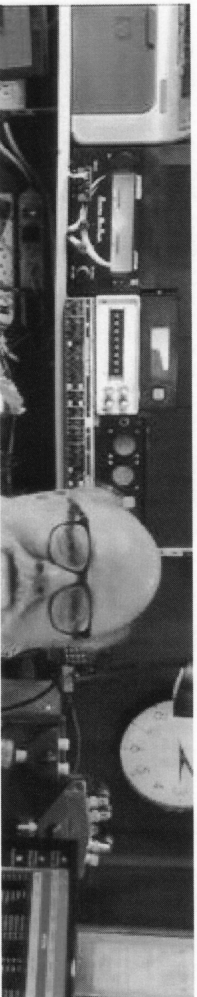

CLAY COUNTY AUXCOMM GROUP TO DEMONSTRATE EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS AT FIELD DAY ON JUNE 26 (Hayesville, NC) Clay County amateur radio operators who are members of the Clay County chapter of North Carolina Auxiliary Emergency Communications Society (NC AUXCOMM), will demonstrate the latest technology in emergency communications ("EMCOMM") on Saturday, June 26, 2021, between 12:00 noon and 5:00 PM, at the Clay County Rec Park Pavilion near the Spikebuck Cherokee Burial Mound, 333 Ball Park Drive, Hayesville, NC.

Children of all ages are invited to drop by and will be given an opportunity to "get on the air" through amateur radio.

June 26-27 is National Field Day for Amateur Radio operators nationwide. Throughout the US (and many foreign countries), ham radio operators will be setting up portable HF radio stations in unusual locations and making contact with others as a display of their emergency communications capabilities.

In recent years, Amateur Radio operators have been deployed by Department of Homeland Security/FEMA and made headlines with their work in the earthquakes, floods, hurricanes (e.g., Katrina, Florence), ice and snow storms, tornadoes, wildfires, and other crises that disrupt commercial and local emergency communications. In addition, they provide supplemental communications when normal systems are rendered inoperable or overloaded. In this regard, Amateur Radio is often referred to as the communications medium that works "When all else fails."

Like most communities, Clay County doesn't expect a major emergency. But such events do happen, and losing communications quickly can turn an emergency into a real disaster. The members of Clay County AUXCOMM train diligently in partnership with the North Carolina Emergency Management Agency and the federal Department
