Subject: Amateur (Ham) Radio National Field Day Next Weekend June 26-27

Amateur Radio operators (Hams) are a vital public service in civic emergencies, when all other communication modes often cannot be used. Virtually every week, ham radio operators relay emergency messages to rescue and medical authorities, and also participate in civic events, such as the LA Marathon, to assist runners who may be in medical trouble. Once a year, each June, national Field Day is held under direction of our national organization, the American Radio Relay League. Several hundred- thousand hams across the country test their equipment for use in such emergencies, contacting other hams everywhere in the United States. Usually this is done in a public park or similar facility, using emergency power sources, like generators. This year, because of Covid19, the hams, such as my own Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club, are using their home radio stations instead of meeting in a public place, as usually occurs. I've been a ham radio operator for 11 years, and have 7 transmitters and 2 antennas in my home station in Rancho Palos Verdes. It's a great thrill to transmit the invitation to communicate over the air, speaking "CQ Field Day KO6MD" [my FCC call sign] into the microphone, and have another ham from Illinois, Florida, Maine, or any other state respond to me. We use voice, Morse code, sophisticated electronic communications [some like the old teletype], and can even bounce a signal off a satellite. Being a retired physician, I can continue my public service, which is exciting and a great inspiration.
